## **AISU Board of Directors Meeting Minutes**

11:00 a.m., Friday June 12, 2015 AISU Board Room (2<sup>nd</sup> Floor Conference Room)

In Attendance: Richard Maxfield, B.J. Millar, Diane Johnson, Kent Mohlman, Nyal McMullen, Mike Farley, Mark Smith, Todd Perry, and Cindy Gardner

- I. Richard Maxfield called the meeting to order at 11:05 a.m.
- II. B.J. Millar motioned to approve the minutes from the May 15, 2015 board meeting.
  - a. Diane Johnson Seconded the motion.
  - b. Votes in favor: Maxfield, Millar, Johnson, Mohlman
  - c. Board meeting minutes from May 15, 2015 are approved.
- III. Financial Report B.J. Millar
  - a. Short-term cash flow
    - 1. As per approval from the last board meeting, Mike Farley was able to secure \$50,000 in a line of credit. (Please see agenda item 4.)
    - 2. EB-5 funds from our new investor will be deposited starting on Monday.
  - b. Revised Budget Draft for 2014-15 needs to be approved by July to submit to Charter School Board.
    - 1. AISU will need to prepare to present case of budget and deficit to Charter School Board.
    - 2. Building a new educational model has additional costs compared to other new charter schools. The charter states that we will supplement cost of development in the first few years of start-up.
    - 3. There are 8 categories that were over budget. Including: technology, marketing, student services, classroom supply, success coaches, teacher assistants, and facilities. We will prepare a clear outline of why these budgets were underestimated when budgeted for. Some of the items in these categories are not categorized correctly.
    - 4. Mike and Todd to get updated categories to finance committee so board has time to approve before July 31<sup>st</sup>.
  - c. Draft Budget for 2015-16
    - 1. No other revenues will be counted towards the 2015-16 budget besides state funding and international student tuition.
- IV. Approval of line of credit
  - d. Wells Fargo approved 2- \$25,000 lines of credit with 10% annual interest.
    - 1. B.J. Millar motioned for the board to approve ongoing access to the Wells Fargo line of credit for short term cash needs with the following process:
      - i. Notification must be given to the finance sub-committee and board chairman.
      - ii. Written approval (i.e. email response) must be given by at least two members of the board including (a) one member

of the finance sub-committee and the (b) board chairman or another member to the finance sub-committee member if board chairman is unavailable before funds/credit can be accessed for the specific incident.

- 2. Diane Johnson seconded the motion.
- 3. Votes in favor: Maxfield, Millar, Johnson and Mohlman (unanimous)
- V. Revised school calendar: adjustments were made to the dates of the last intensive, half day adjustments were made to end at 1 p.m. and shifts to professional development days.
  - a. B.J. Millar motioned to approve the revised school calendar.
  - b. Diane Johnson seconded the motion.
  - c. Votes in favor: Maxfield, Millar, Johnson, Mohlman (unanimous)
- VI. AIS EB-5 Program report
  - 1. New TEA area has been approved at the north end of the UVU campus. We should consider looking at this area for EB-5 investment.
  - 2. We are inviting our current international student parents to the AIS,LLC EB-5 investment.
- VII. Facility improvement status report Mark Smith
  - a. \$900,000 improvement cost cap.
- VIII. AISU@Home Overview Mark Smith
  - a. Montessori based PK-2<sup>nd</sup> grade program: AISU supplies Montessori manipulative, monthly training sessions for parents, free online access to *Dreambox and Lexia*, participate in fieldtrips, and use the *Compass* program which is used to map the Montessori skill set and the Utah core skill set. There is currently no support for parents that want to do Montessori at home.
  - b. Grades 3<sup>rd</sup>- 5<sup>th</sup>: Exploration based.
  - c. Middle School and High School: blended learning and intensives.
  - d. As far as the state is concerned the AISU@Home students are considered the same as AISU on campus students. AISU@Home students have a restriction with campus use to morning and afternoon flex study time except for math in certain circumstances. Students can participate in any non-core class on campus including: preforming arts and STEM.
  - e. Any student that is enrolled in AISU@Home program for the 2015-16 school year can be enrolled in the AISU on campus program for the 2016-17 school year without needing to go through the lottery process.
  - IX. Program discussion of Lindsay Strait Consulting Services
    - a. Consulting service to AISU would be given a large discount in the amount of \$10,000 (the regular price is between \$30,000- \$40,000.) These services would include data collection and analysis.
    - b. Richard Maxfield to send the comprehensive proposal with detail of scope of work.

- c. Board to discuss this proposal during the July board meeting to allow adequate time to review.
- X. Intensive Program Discussion Nathan Justis
  - a. 63 intensives were offered during the 2014-15 school year. Including courses from STEM, Performance Arts, History, Humanities, and English. There were at least 60 field trips and 40+ community partnerships.
